

SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Some thoughts on today's scripture



The most painful wounds we carry with us from the past are more wounds of the spirit than of the body. Of these spiritual wounds the one that

causes us most pain is that of a belief that we are insignificant. In this Gospel story we hear in Jesus' words to the leper, his concern to heal this wound we carry with us from the past.

In your prayer today tell Jesus of some way you were hurt or wounded by something people said or did to you. Listen to how sensitive and responsive he is when he is "moved with pity" or compassion for you. Tell him how you feel about him being like this.

Attend carefully to the leper's prayer: "If you choose, you can make me clean". And to Jesus' reply: "I do choose. Be made clean". What does this exchange tell you about the leper's convictions and feelings, as well as those of Jesus? Have you seen this pattern in your own prayers of petition?

Ma, in ogni caso, questi sono segni del potere che il Figlio dell'uomo ha ricevuto da colui che lo ha mandato per liberare da una schiavitù più profonda, da una lebbra più cronica, per liberare dal peccato.

Chi può perdonare i peccati, se non Dio? "Ora, perché sappiate che il Figlio dell'uomo ha il potere in terra di rimettere i peccati: alzati disse al paralitico, prendi il tuo letto e va' a casa tua" (Mt 9,6).



Today's Gospel says that "Jesus was moved with pity when He saw a leper". Are you moved with love and compassion when you see the outcasts of today's society? Today, Jesus continues to call forward men and women to minister as
