Lent: A Time of Grace and Renewal

2026 ASH WEDNESDAY

ASHES ON THE FOREHEAD



The act of applying ashes to our forehead symbolizes our mortality as well as our need for ongoing repentance.

Ashes are applied to our forehead in the sign of the cross as the words, "Remember, you are dust and to dust you shall return" are spoken to us. The other formula which is used, "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel" emphasizes our call to continual conversion and holiness of life.


PARISH POLICY ON GIVING

Lenten Message 2026

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

May Jesus and Mary be in your hearts.

As we enter the holy season of Lent, we are invited to journey into the desert with Christ. This is not a solitary path. Sacred Scripture reminds us that God does not save us in isolation, but gathers us as one people (cf. Lumen Gentium, 9; CCC 781). Lent, therefore, is not only about personal conversion, but about healing and

renewing our relationships with God and with one another.

Sin is never merely private; it wounds the whole Body. Likewise, true conversion restores communion. The Gospel calls us not simply “to be better,” but “to be reconciled” (cf. 2 Cor 5:20). In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the Lord renews both our friendship with Him and our bonds within the Church.

Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving take on deeper meaning when lived together. Prayer unites us. Fasting reorders our hearts. Almsgiving expresses solidarity in love.

As we begin this Lenten season, let us pray for the grace not only to walk toward Easter individually, but to arrive there together – as one Body in Christ, led from the desert to the joy of the Resurrection. May Our Blessed Mother guide us on this journey of renewal.
