PARISH HALL RENTING

We will resume renting the parish hall following a review of the circumstances and several requests. To rent the hall, you must meet these requirements:

1. Enter into a contract with the parish, agreeing to the terms and accepting responsibility for the usage period.

2. Cover the cost of insurance while using it.

3. In the event of use, apply for and pay for an LCBO license.

4. Only when no church events are going on, like meetings or catechism lessons, may the parish hall be rented.

5. The cost is \$280 for parishioners who have been enrolled in the parish and have been a regular contributor for at least six months.

6. There is a \$400 fee for non-parishioners (those who are not enrolled in the parish and do not regularly donate to the cause).

7. No activity that does not align with Christian Catholic values may be rented out the venue.8. It is not possible to rent the hall for a child's birthday.
